<u>Context:</u>	In a string with other letters, in ABC order.	A, B, C, D, E, F, G...	
<u>Grammar & Context</u>		<u>Meaning</u>	
<u>GS Form:</u>	–	Combines with other letters to spell words.	
<u>GS Desc:</u>	part of string	<u>Example</u>	
<u>Context:</u>	In a string with other letters, with the string acting as the Subject of the verb “spell”.	“C-A-T” spells “cat”. “Cat” is spelled “C”, “A”, “T”.	
<u>Grammar & Context</u>		<u>Meaning</u>	
<u>GS Form:</u>	–	Combines with other letters and numbers to spell a code or serial number.	
<u>GS Desc:</u>	part of string	<u>Example</u>	
<u>Context:</u>	In a string with other letters and numbers, with the string acting as a G.Entity.	The code is “C-A-T-1-3-3-7”.

<u>GS Form:</u>	(noun) A	Gives a generic, ordinal name to something, indicating it is the first (noun) in a series.	
<u>GS Desc:</u>	t.mod to noun	<u>Example</u>	
<u>Context:</u>	Builds phrase which is used as a name, without “a/an/the”.	Please complete Section A.

<u>GS Form:</u>	(det) A, (det) A’s	The “A” symbol.		
<u>GS Desc:</u>	–	<u>Example</u>		
<u>Context:</u>	Used to talk about “A” as a symbol.	The “A” should be uppercase. This word has two “A’s”

<u>Grammar & Context</u>		<u>Meaning</u>	
<u>GS Form:</u>	A (noun), (noun) A	Gives a class type and level to something.	
<u>GS Desc:</u>	attrib or t.mod to noun	<u>Example</u>	
<u>Context:</u>	“A” combines with a word that denotes some kind of type or class, building an Adjective Phrase.	We only use Grade-A beef. He is an A-Rank adventurer.

<u>Grammar & Context</u>			<u>Meaning</u>	
<u>GS Form:</u>	–		A grade for a test, assignment, or entire class.	
<u>GS Desc:</u>	–		<u>Example</u>	
<u>Context:</u>	Usually in a school context.		I got an “A” on my test! My daughter got “A’s” in all her classes.

a		“a” Form	Determiner	ehh-eee, uhh
an		“an” Form		aaa-nnn, eh-hnn
<u>Grammar & Context</u>			<u>Meaning</u>	
<u>GS Form:</u>	a (noun)		Indicates the modified Noun is Singular and Indefinite. (“A” must only be used before Consonant Sounds.)	
<u>GS Desc:</u>	attributive to noun		<u>Example</u>	
<u>Context:</u>	–		I am a banana!
